## CCRCC Aerobatic Havoc IMAC Contest Report.

In spite of wind gusts of 25 mph, 21 pilots flew under sunny skies. There were five entries in Basic, which was won by Jeff Carte of Patuxent Aeromodelers, from Hollywood, MD. In Sportsman there were also five entries and Patuxent Aeromodeler pilot John Morisi took the class. Mike Brown from Crownsville, MD beat three others to win the Intermediate class. Pete Castine from Harrisburg, PA won Advanced and Dave Michael from Laurel, MD won Unlimited from a class of five. Three pilots braved the gusting winds to show-off in Freestyle. Andy Kane of Silver Spring, MD won this with an impressive flight.

The event was catered by Sweet Nellie's BBQ Emporium, Vic Curtis, one of our own CCRCC club members. All registered pilots ate free of charge. On Saturday everyone dined on smoked top round roast beef sandwiches and on Sunday, beer-butt chicken. Both meals were accompanied by french fries, baked beans and assorted desserts.
